

Consent for Summary Care Record with Additional Information

The Summary Care Record (SCR) is a brief snapshot of your GP medical record which holds details of the medication you are on, allergies you may have and details of any adverse reactions you have experienced. With your permission, the practice can add essential details about your healthcare which can be very difficult to remember, particularly when you are unwell. Having Additional Information in your Summary Care Record means that, when you need healthcare, you will be helped to recall these vital details.

The Summary Care Record with Additional Information can be used by other NHS organisations, such as A&E and Out of Hours. These organisations can only access this information with your permission and with the appropriate rights. There may be occasional circumstances where a clinician is unable to consult you. For example, if you are unconscious, healthcare staff may look at your record without asking you. An audit trail is kept to identify who has viewed your record, where and when.
